4. What is typology? How might we work with something as a type, if it is not mentioned in the New Testament?
5. According to the instructor, what are the five presuppositions or *lenses* that the New Testament writers had when they were interpreting the Old Testament?
6. What does the instructor mean by Christo-telic? How do you think this kind of interpretation should affect the way one preaches or teaches from any text within the Bible?
7. In light of this instruction, how would you approach Mark 8:27–9:1 and its Biblical Theological connection to Daniel 7:9-14? How does seeing this connection help you better understand Mark 8:27-9:1?
